RAM Nation Virtual Academy is:

- Located at the Trotwood Madison Board of Education.
- A full five day/week instructional program consisting of Ohio licensed teachers who deliver instruction through a blended learning platform.



• An instructional environment where parents and students can get in-person and virtual academic and social-emotional support.





RAM Nation Virtual Academy is:

• A supportive environment where students connect with mentors who motivate and inspire them to achieve.



• A student-centered environment where Trotwood students remain Trotwood students and have access to all the benefits and services of TMCS.





Anticipate:

Home Environment: Choose designated well-lit, quiet, comfortable area; may vary

Schedule: Design a DAILY schedule WITH your student that works best for your family

Routine: Set a daily routine with regard to mental, physical, social, and emotional health i.e. establish wake up and bedtime routine, meal routine, scheduled breaks, etc.

Computer: Learn and download all necessary tools; reliable internet options



Phone: Save contacts, Reminds, and limit phone time during school

Email: Link emails to phone and save email account as bookmark

Facilitate:

Daily: Discuss with your child daily goals based on the content and assignments; may vary

Set small, achievable goals and reward those accomplishments

Weekly: Establish a weekly goal per course and visually track that goal

Examine student progress via report or student login

Plan to address any missing work or low grades

Bi-weekly: Contact mentor at a designated time

Find alternate support or outside resources for help





Communicate:

Student: Set a time to discuss the day with your student;

Be consistent; Use visuals such as calendars



Mentor: Return all mentor emails promptly and reach out as needed; develop a strong relationship with the mentor - they WANT to talk to you!

Special Ed: Connect with special ed services and stay in touch for IEP and SDI goals


Outside support: Line up outside supports where you anticipate struggle



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Learning Coach Role

What exactly is a learning coach?

A learning coach is a parent, family member, or another adult that is at home with the student while the student is going through their courses. If students are going through courses at a school, a Learning Coach could be a teacher, para pro, or assigned mentor.

The role of the Learning Coach is to:

- · Guide the student through the lessons as needed
- Discuss the concepts being taught
- · Assist with interactive tools and games
- Oversee assignments
- · Help facilitate hands-on learning that may be in the course
- · Check for understanding of assignments
- Keep the student on schedule and pace
- Ensure all course components are being done with fidelity (independent reading, novel studies, practice activities, etc.)
- · Communicate with the teacher as needed

Understanding the importance of your role as a learning coach is key to the success of your student. As a learning coach, you are committed to helping your student going beyond what is online and bringing those concepts to life.
